Canaries in the Mine

Concern #1: Teens and Cell Phones

- Teenagers and cell phones are often not a good combination.
- My wife and I can tell you from first hand experience. Our last cell phone bill was more than our first house payment.
- Thankfully, our children have jobs, and they get to contribute to the bill.
- But there are many reasons why parents must monitor the use of cell phones with their teenagers.

Cell Phones and School

Just because kids are in school doesn't mean their phones are turned off. Thirty-eight percent of teens surveyed text-message with friends during school hours. A smaller 30 percent of students say they play video games on their phones while at school. Parents who look at their kid's calls will realize 26 percent of kids speak with people mom and dad wouldn't approve of.

Cell Phones and Teen Socialization

- ◆ The cell phone has become a primary mode of socializing for teens and they will often avoid contact with peers that don't have cell phones, according to a study by Context. The Baltimore company uses anthropologists to study consumer trends.
- "Next time a teenager says, 'Mom if I don't have a phone,' or 'Dad, if I don't have a phone, I'm going to be a nobody,' they are being serious," said Robbie Blinkoff, Context's principal anthropologist.

Dateline Findings

When "Dateline" surfed MySpace, they found scenes of binge drinking, apparent drug use, teens posing in underwear, and other members simulating sex, and in some cases even having it.... Teens listed not only their names, and addresses, but even cell phone numbers and after school schedules.

Self Creation and Deception

"When people join MySpace, they discover a world where they can be whatever and whoever they want to be. Sometimes young people struggling with low selfesteem may tune out friends and family to meet and impress people with an imaginary or exaggerated identity online. Cyber interaction can replace reality for these individuals" (Internet Guide for Parents, Family Research Council, Washington, D.C., 10).

Concern #3: Pornography

"Pornography is evil. I love the story told at the funeral of Henry Eyring's father. When he was a young man coming across the border from the Mexican colonies to the United States, the customs man said, "Son, do you have any pornography in your suitcase or trunks?" He responded, "No sir, we don't even own a pornograph." It's wonderful to be that pure and naive. We know pornography is addictive and destructive" (Vaughn J. Featherstone, "One Link Still Holds," *Ensign*, Nov. 1999, 13).

Don't Look In The Box

"Hello, Son. You've probably noticed that big cardboard box in the middle of your bedroom floor. As you've heard, it contains a bunch of [pornographic] magazines. Underneath those are hardcore magazines. Underneath those are hardcore magazines containing some of the worst kind of hardcore sexual imagery available in the world, including illegal child pornography—you've probably been curious about what 'hardcore' looks like, haven't you?

"I'm sorry that it has to be in the middle of the floor— I know you'll trip over it every time you enter the room, which will renew once again your curiosity about what the box contains. Also, I'm sorry about all that mail which comes to you and enticingly describes certain magazine issues which are in the box. Remember: don't look in the box.

Don't Look in the Box

"Your 15 now; old enough to spend significant time home alone as your Mom and I go on various errands and events, and your brother and sister are involved in their activities. Of course, there is no way I would know if you looked in the box. In fact, you could safely remove quite a few issues and keep them elsewhere —I wouldn't notice. But please: don't look in the box.

Don't Look in the Box

"I realize that as a teenager, your sexual drive is stronger now than at any other time in your life. So, not only will curiosity fuel your desire to look in the box, but your hormones will be begging you to do so as well. And once, when you tripped on the box and one issue tumbled out, what you saw as your hurriedly put it back ignited your interest. It took every bit of willpower you had to not flip through the issue in your hands. But no matter what: don't look in the box" (Internet Guide for Parents, Family Research Council, Washington, D.C., 10).

What is Pornography?

"Pornography is any material depicting or describing the human body or sexual conduct in a way that arouses sexual feelings. It is distributed through many media, including magazines, books, television, movies, music, and the Internet. It is as harmful to the spirit as tobacco, alcohol, and drugs are to the body. Using pornographic material in any way is a violation of a commandment of God: "Thou shalt not ... commit adultery ... nor do anything like unto it" (D&C 59:6). It can lead to other serious sins. Members of the Church should avoid pornography in any form and should oppose its production, distribution, and use.

Pornography is Tragically Addictive

"Pornography is tragically addictive. Like other addictions, it leads people to experiment and to seek more powerful stimulations. If you experiment with it and allow yourself to remain caught in its trap, it will destroy you, degrading your mind, heart, and spirit. It will rob you of self-respect and of your sense of the beauties of life. It will tear you down and lead you to evil thoughts and possibly evil actions. It will cause terrible damage to your family relationships.

Pornography Will Ruin Your Life

"Because of the addictive nature of pornography and the harm it can cause to body and spirit, servants of God have repeatedly warned us to shun it. If you are caught in the trap of pornography, stop immediately and seek help. Through repentance, you can receive forgiveness and find hope in the gospel. Go to your bishop or branch president for counsel on how to overcome your problem, and seek healing through the Atonement of Jesus Christ. Ask the Lord to give you the strength to overcome this terrible addiction" (True to the Faith, Pornography, 117–18).

Pornography is Dangerous and Addictive

Stay Away from Pornography

"Stay away from pornography! Avoid it as you would a terrible disease. It is a consuming disease. It is addictive. It gets hold of men and grasps them until they can scarcely let it go.... These magazines, these video tapes, these late night programs, you don't need them. They will just hurt you, they won't help you. They will destroy you, if you persist in looking at them" (President Gordon B, Hinckley, Teachings of Gordon B, Hinckley, 463).



Pornography Destroys Individuals and Families

"One of the most damning influences on earth, one that has caused uncountable grief, suffering, heartache, and destroyed marriages is the onslaught of pornography in all of its vicious, corroding, destructive forms. Whether it be through the printed page, movies, television, obscene lyrics, the telephone, or on a flickering personal computer screen,

"pornography is overpoweringly addictive and severely damaging. This potent tool of Lucifer degrades the mind, heart, and the soul of any who use it. All who are caught in its seductive, tantalizing web and remain so, will become addicted to its immoral destructive influence" (Richard G. Scott, Ensign, May 2000, 36).

Consequences of Pornography

- It is a perversion of normal love and affection and vulgarizes sacred procreative power
- Continued involvement changes normal thoughts and attitudes regarding male and female relationships
- It weakens the users spiritual strength, personal life, marriage, and family relationships
- It destroys an individuals sense of self-worth
- It isolates users from their families, society, and the Church
- Some men have lost everything: their spouse, their children, and their careers.

Physiological Changes

When you view those pictures, and subsequently, have "immoral thoughts," not only is your mind impacted, but your whole system. Visual or cognitive concentration on a sexual image immediately begins to release several of the body's powerful hormones, which create a desire for more sexual feelings. Young men, you must not lust; and you must not entertain immoral thoughts.

Jacob 2: Lessons from Jacob on Sexual Sin

- 31 For behold, I, the Lord, have seen the sorrow, and heard the mourning of the daughters of my people in the land of Jerusalem, yea, and in all the lands of my people, because of the wickedness and abominations of their husbands.
- 32 And I will not suffer, saith the Lord of Hosts, that the cries of the fair daughters of this people, which I have led out of the land of Jerusalem, shall come up unto me against the men of my people, saith the Lord of Hosts.
- For they shall not lead away captive the daughters of my people because of their tenderness, save I shall visit them with a sore curse, even unto destruction; for they shall not commit whoredoms, like unto them of old, saith the Lord of Hosts.

True Doctrine

"Whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart" (Matthew 5:28).

"And verily I say unto you, as I have said before, he that looketh on a woman to lust after her, or if any shall commit adultery in their hearts, they shall not have the Spirit, but shall deny the faith and shall fear" (D&C 63:16).

True Doctrine (Cont.)

"For our words will condemn us, yea, all our works will condemn us; we shall not be found spotless; and our thoughts will also condemn us; and in this awful state we shall not dare to look up to our God; and we would fain be glad if we could command the rocks and the mountains to fall upon us to hide us from his presence" (Alma 12:14).

A Prophet's Plea

"I plead with you boys ... to keep yourselves free from the stains of the world. You must not indulge in sleazy talk at school. You must not tell sultry jokes. You must not fool around with the Internet to find pornographic material. You must not dial a long-distance telephone number to listen to filth. You must not rent videos with pornography of any kind. This salacious stuff simply is not for you. Stay away from pornography as you would avoid a serious disease. It is as destructive. It can become habitual, and those who indulge in it get so they cannot leave it alone. It is addictive.

Prophet's Plea (Cont.)

"It is a five-billion-dollar business for those who produce it. They make it as ... attractive as they know how. It seduces and destroys its victims. It is everywhere It is all about us. I plead with you young men not to get involved in its use. You simply cannot afford to.

"The girl you marry is worthy of a husband whose life has not been tainted by this ugly and corrosive material" (President Gordon B. Hinckley, Ensign, May 1998, 49).

Pornography Worse Than Most Addictions

"Pornographic or erotic stories and pictures are worse than filthy or polluted food. The body has defenses to rid itself of unwholesome food. With a few fatal exceptions, bad food will only make you sick but do no permanent harm. In contrast, a person who feasts upon filthy stories or pornographic or erotic pictures and literature records them in this marvelous retrieval system we call a brain. The brain won't vomit back filth. Once recorded, it will always remain subject to recall, flashing its perverted images across your mind and drawing you away from the wholesome things in life" (Dallin H. Oaks, Challenges for the Year Ahead (pamphlet, 1974), 4–5; reprinted in "Things They're Saying," New Era, Feb. 1974, 18).

We Have a Prophet

"As a young child, I believed we had a prophet and that he spoke the truth; but I'm not sure I understood that the prophet was speaking to me personally. When I was a young wife and mother, my husband spent two years in the air force. We lived in military housing on Long Island, New York. While tending our young children, I often visited with neighbors who had come from all over the country. One day as a neighbor and I were talking about our beliefs, she became curious about what was different about The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

We Have a Prophet

I told her briefly about the Restoration, and I explained that the restored Church of Jesus Christ has a living prophet today. This really seemed to pique her interest, and she wanted to know what the prophet had said. As I started to tell her about the Doctrine and Covenants and modern revelation, she said, "But what has he said lately?" I told her about general conference and that the Church had a monthly publication with a message from the prophet. Then she got really interested. I was so embarrassed to admit that I hadn't read the current message. She concluded our conversation by saying, "You mean you have a living prophet and you don't know what he said?" In that situation I hadn't shown what it meant to sustain" (Janette Hales Beckham, "Sustaining the Living Prophets," Ensign, May 1996, 84).
